

## Gaddle Strip Qailt

Note: This quilt is made using the "sew and flip" method. Each strip is sewn onto the foundation of the quilt, stitching through the strip, batting and backing all at once.

Visit the Learning Center at www.cuddlesoftquilts.com for a "how-to" video.

Seam allowance is 1/2" unless otherwise stated.

Arrange the strips in the order you choose.

Center the backing, right side up, on the batting.

Fold the batting in half and spray with adhesive. Position back over the backing, pressing in place, smoothing as you go. Repeat for the other half of the quilt. Trim away excess batting so edges are even with backing fabric.

Use a fine-line permanent marker (such as a Sharpie) to mark a line in the horizontal center of the quilt.



Secure your center strip to the batting/backing using adhesive spray, centering strip over drawn line.

Working outward from the center, add the next strip over the first one, right sides together, matching raw edges. Pin in place then stitch down. Spray batting/backing under where the second strip goes with adhesive. Flip and press sewn strip in place, working out wrinkles as you go.

Repeat with the next strip.

Work in numerical order as shown in image.

Optional: Quilt strips as desired.

Trim edges even and bind with 2" strips of binding fabric.
