Square-in-a-Square Pillow

Approximate Finished Size: 18" x 18"

The classic Square-in-a-Square quilt block is transformed into a textural pillow—appliqué style! Use your stash to make the patchwork your own.

Fabric Requirements (as shown)

- 8½" blue squares in a variety of Luxe Cuddle® Cover sample uses Luxe Cuddle®: Heather Chambray, Wild Rabbit Outer Space, and Galaxy Navy
- ¹/₂ yard Luxe Cuddle[®] Tuscany Ink, *Pillow Back*
- 1/2 yard Luxe Cuddle® Frosted Hide Navy, Accent Square, Borders

Suggested Notions

- Batting, 1 (22" x 22") square
- Zipper, 16" length
- Double-sided basting tape, 1 yard (1/8"-1/4" width)
- Polyester filling for stuffing —or— 20" pillow insert
- 90/14 stretch machine needle
- Polyester thread
- Felt tip marker or ballpoint pen
- Rotary cutter and mat
- Micro-serrated scissors and/or craft knife
- Long, flower head pins and/or fabric clips
- Stiletto
- Basting spray
- Walking foot

Cutting + Preparation Using Luxe Cuddle®

- 1. Label (8¹/₂") pieces: Front Squares.
- 1. From Tuscany Ink, cut: - 1 (15" x 19"), Upper Back.

- 1 (5" x 19"), Lower Back.

- 2. From Frosted Hide Navy, cut:
 - 1 (7" x 7"), Appliqué.
 - 2 (2¹/₂" x 17"), Side Borders.
 - 2 (2¹/₂" x 19"), *Top/Bottom Borders*.

Assembly

Mark the batting

- 1. Draw a 16" square in the center of the batting.
- 2. Draw additional lines 2" beyond the square.

Make the pillow front

- 1. Sew the Front Squares into two sets of two. Finger press seams open.
- 2. Spray baste the back of one set. Align on the top line of the 16" square.
- 3. With *right sides together*, place the second set on the first. Double pin, then sew in place through all three layers.
- 4. Spray baste the second set and flip it onto the batting. Note: The four squares should fill the drawn 16" square.

Add the Borders


1. With right sides together, align and double pin the side borders to the center square.



- 2. Sew to the 4-patch block. Spray baste, flip, and smooth to the batting.
- 3. In the same manner. sew top and bottom borders to the pillow.

Note: The borders should align with the outer drawn line.

4. Zigzag around the edge.



- Add the appliaué
- 1. Spray baste the wrong side of the Appliqué square.
- 2. Align the four corners of the Appliqué with the seam lines of the

4-patch block. Pin in place.

3. Use a 3x3mm zigzag to appliqué the edges of the white square.

Make the pillow back

- 1. Align the Back pieces with the naps in the same direction.
- 2. Finish the interior edges with a zigzag or by serging.
- 3. Flip the Lower Back onto the Upper Back, right sides together.

Nap

4. Pin and sew a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " seam at both ends. Backstitch at both ends of the seams.

- 5. Fold the Upper Back down behind the Lower Back, leaving the seam allowance standing.
- 6. Add double-sided basting tape to the right side of the seam allowance of the Upper Back. Press to adhere.
- 7. Place the *right side*
- of the zipper to the basting tape.
- 8. Sew zipper tape to the allowance. Sew to seam allowance only *Note: Zipper tape* is sewn **only** to the seam allowance.
- 9. In the same manner, add a line of basting tape to the right side of the seam allowance of the Lower Back.
- 10. Press the other side of the zipper tape to the basting tape. Again, sew the zipper to the seam allowance only.

Cuddle[®] Basics

- 1. Seam allowances are $\frac{1}{2}$ " unless otherwise noted.
- 2. Use a felt tip marker or ballpoint pen to trace appliqués or mark measurements on reverse side of Cuddle[®]
- 3. Cut Cuddle[®] with a rotary cutter, craft knife, or scissors.
- 4. Shake cut pieces or put in a no-heat dryer with a damp washcloth for a few minutes to remove loose fibers.
- 5. Sew with polyester thread in the top and the bobbin.


Finishina

1. Open the zipper halfway.

Note: The pillow will be turned right side out through the zipper opening.

2. With right sides together, pin the corners of the Pillow Front to the corners of the Back. Continue to pin around the perimeter.

Note: Pin halfway between the corner pins, then double-pin *between those* pins. Pin a lot.



- 3. Sew Back to the Front. Pivot at the corners with the needle down.
- 4. Turn the pillow right side out through the zipper opening.
- 5. Gently push out the corners with a point turner.
- 6. Insert a pillow form or stuff as desired.
- 6. Reduce presser foot pressure when sewing multiple layers.
- 7. Increase stitch length to 3–4 mm.
- 8. Double pin by using 2 rows of pinsthe first row every 11/2" along the seam line and a second row 1" to the left and parallel to the cut edge.

Sew Together Tuesday

- 9. Backstitch at the beginning and end of each seam.
- 10. Use an even-feed or walking foot, if possible. It makes a difference!
