Crazy 8 Quilt

Approximate Finished Size: 58" x 68"

Collect your favorite fabrics and stitch them together in this fun quilt. Quilt top is assembled using Stitch-and-Flip construction—a great technique even if you are new to working with Cuddle*.

Fabric Requirements

- 1½ yard Main Fabric, Strips, Binding
- % yard Fabric A, Strips
- 5/8 yard Fabric B, Strips
- 2 yards, Backing

Suggested Notions

- 90/14 stretch machine needle
- Polyester thread
- Felt tip marker and/or ballpoint pen
- Rotary cutter and mat
- Micro-serrated scissors and/or craft knife
- Long, flower head pins
- Fabric clips
- Stiletto
- Basting spray
- Parchment paper or newsprint, to prevent overspray
- Walking foot

Cuddle® Basics

IF THIS IS YOUR FIRST TIME working with Cuddle®—or your tenth! these simple guidelines will make your sewing experience a pleasure.

- 1. Seam allowances are ½" unless otherwise noted.
- 2. Mark measurements on the wrong side of Cuddle® with a felt tip marker or ballpoint pen.
- 3. Cut Cuddle® with a rotary cutter, craft knife, or micro-serrated scissors.
- 4. Shake cut pieces or put in a no-heat dryer with a damp washcloth for a few minutes to remove loose fibers.
- 5. Sew with polyester thread in the top and the bobbin.
- 6. Reduce presser foot pressure when sewing multiple layers.
- 7. Increase stitch length to 3-4 mm.
- 8. Double pin by using 2 rows of pins—the first row every 1½" along the seam line and a second row 1" to the left and parallel to the cut edge.
- 9. Backstitch at the beginning and end of each seam.
- 10. If possible, use a walking foot. It makes a difference!

- Machine needle: 90/14 stretch needle
- Polyester thread
- Felt tip marker
- Ballpoint pen
- Rotary cutter and mat
- Micro-serrated scissors
- Craft knife
- Long, flower head pins

- Point turner
- Basting spray
- Walking foot

How to Wash Cuddle®

- Machine wash on gentle with cool water.
- (Do not use fabric softener!)
- Machine dry on low heat for about ten minutes.
- · Hang until dry.

Preparation

Identify and label:

- Cuddle®
 - Main, 1½ yard, Strips, Binding
 - Fabric A, 5% yard, Strips
 - Fabric B, 5% yard, *Strips*
 - Backing, 2 yards

Cutting

Label the strips after they are cut. A chart to record your fabrics is on page three.

- 1. From Main Fabric, cut:
 - 4 (10" x 58"), Main Strips.
- 2. Cut one of these 10" Main Fabric. Strips lengthwise into 4 equal
 - 4 (2½" x 58") *Main Slim Strips*.
- 3. From the remaining Main, cut:
 - 5 (1¾" x woF*), Binding.
- 4. From Fabric A, cut:
 - 2 (10" x 58"), Fabric A Strips.
- 5. From Fabric B, cut: :
 - 4 (5" x 58"), Fabric B Strips.


Assembly

1. Fold Backing in half horizontally. Mark fold on the wrong side.



- 2. Center a 10" Main Strip over the marked horizontal line. wrong sides together.
 - *Note: The nap of the Strip and* Backing should both run down.
- 3. Fold Strip in half and spray baste. Smooth onto Backing. Press to adhere. Baste

the other half.



- 4. Place a 5" Fabric B Strip, *right* side up, along the bottom edge of the Main Strip. Have naps run in the same direction.
- 5. Flip the Strip up, matching the raw edges.
- 6. Double pin at the Fabric B Backing (Wrong Side) beginning, end, and

center of the Strips. Then double pin between.

7. Sew the Strip stitching through all three layers.



^{*} wor = *Width of Fabric*

- 8. Using parchment paper to cover the right side of the Main Fabric Strip, spray baste the wrong side of the Fabric B Strip. Flip down and smooth onto Backing. Also sew a Fabric B Strip to the top.
- 9. Following the *Assembly Chart* and keeping the naps running in the same direction, sew these Strips to the top and bottom:
 - 2½" Main Slim Strip
 - 10" Fabric A
 - 2½" Main Slim Strip
 - 5" Fabric B
 - 10" Main Fabric




Assembly Chart

Binding


- 1. Trim the edges as necessary and square up to about 58" x 68".
- 2. Pin Binding strips, right sides together, on the diagonal. Sew between the pins. Trim seam allowance to ½".

Note: Have the nap of all strips go in the same direction.

- 3. Starting halfway down one side and leaving an 8" tail, pin the right side of the Binding strip to the Backing.
- 4. Using a ½" seam allowance, sew the Binding strip until ½" from corner. Stop with needle down.



- 5. Lift presser foot and pivot the quilt. Sew to the corner at a 45° angle. Remove the quilt and clip the thread.
- 6. Turn quilt 90° to the left.
 Fold Binding straight up to form the miter.




Quilt Edge


Backing

Sew

- 8. Pin at the corner.
- 9. Starting at the miter, sew Binding to the edge, again stopping ½" before the corner. Create another miter.



11. Where Binding strips meet, fold the tails at 45° angles. Mark the folds. Pin, then sew along the marked lines. Trim seam.




12. Sew remaining edge of the Binding.



13. Flip so the quilt top is up. Fold Binding to the quilt top, keeping it snugly against the edge.


- 14. Match raw edge of the Binding to previous stitching line. Use fabric clips to hold the Binding in place.
- 15. Topstitch on the right side of the quilt top, using a 4x4mm zigzag or a serpentine stitch. Note: Stitch with the needle coming down just left of the raw edge.



16. To soften the edge, use a stiletto to fluff fibers from topstitching.

FABRIC NOTES

It's helpful to jot down your fabric choices to keep on track as you assemble the quilt. Here's the spot to do it! Pin actual fabric samples or fill in the blocks with colored pencils to stay organized.



Make It Your Own!

Crazy 8 quilts are based on a variety of strips. Strips can be cut into different widths and rearranged as you desire. Try one of the variations below—or design your own!



Tips + Tools

for working with Cuddle®

Mark before cutting.

Smooth Cuddle® on a flat surface—a large table, the floor, or a cutting mat. Use a permanent, felt tip marker or ballpoint pen to mark your cutting line on the back of the fabric.

Get rid of the Cuddle® dust.

Vacuum edges as you cut, then put the cut pieces into a dryer with a damp washcloth. Tumble at low or no heat for about five minutes. All the loose fibers will end up in your lint trap!

Lengthen the stitch length. Lower the foot pressure.

Start with a 3mm straight stitch, increasing it if necessary. If the foot is pushing the fabric forward, lower the pressure on the foot.

Use a walking foot

If your machine did not come with a walking foot, we recommend getting one. A walking foot helps both layers of Cuddle* move along more smoothly. A dual-feed system will substitute for a walking foot.

Use basting spray to keep fabric in place.


Basting spray is a convenient way to keep fabric smooth and in position for sewing strips or binding. Use parchment paper or newsprint to prevent overspray.

Cut with the right tools.

Use a rotary cutter for Cuddle® 3 and Cuddle® Dimple. For Luxe Cuddle®, a craft knife is a better option. Cut from the wrong side to avoid cutting the fibers, and reducing Cuddle® dust.

Double pin for stability.

Pin the first row every 1½" along the cut edge and a second row 1" to the left of this row of pins. Alternate positions, but stay parallel to the edge.



Use a 90/14 stretch needle.

Since Cuddle* is a knit fabric, the best needle is 90/14 Stretch needle. Jersey and Ballpoint needles are also good choices. Universals will often result in skipped stitches.

Always use polyester thread.

Polyester thread has increased strength and a slight stretch. Since Cuddle[®] is a polyester fabric with a bit of stretch, the two work together nicely. Fill your bobbin with polyester thread, too!

Wash it the right way.

All Cuddle® and Luxe Cuddle® fabrics are machine washable in cool water and a low-heat. Never, ever use fabric softeners or high heat.
