Machine Embroidery on Cuddle®

Successful machine embroidery on Cuddle® depends on correctly preparing the area to be embroidered.


Cuddle® is best hooped using a technique called "floating," so-called because the fabric being embroidered "floats" above the hoop.

Here's how:



What you need to hoop


- · Cuddle® to embroider
- Medium cut-away stabilizer
- · Woven fusible interfacing (optional, but recommended)
- · Water soluble topping
- · Painter's or paper tape
- Spray baste



Since Cuddle® is a knit fabric, it needs to be stabilized to prevent it from stretching or shifting while it's being embroidered.

Why is the woven fusible optional?

Pressing* a woven fusible to the Cuddle® before hooping gives a bit more stability, especially for larger embroideries. Once fused, treat the interfaced Cuddle® as a single layer.






Thread

TOP SPOOL 40 wt. polyester—preferred for its strength and flexibility.

BOBBIN 60 wt. polyester bobbin thread

Preparing the hoop

- 1 Hoop the cut-away stabilizer
- 2 Spray baste the wrong side of the Cuddle®. Smooth it in place on the cut-away.
- 3 Tape the topping over the Cuddle®. (Use painter's or paper tape.)

What is "topper"?

Topper is a film-type material, designed to stop embroidery stitches from sinking into the Cuddle®.

What are "knockdown stitches"? Do I need them?

Knockdown stitches are a closely sewn grid that create an underlay on the pile so the embroidery stands out. Use them when working with Luxe Cuddle®. These stitches may come with your design file, or can be created with a stand-alone program such as Embrilliance Enthusiast.



* Refer to manufacturer's guidelines for all fusibles and stabilizers. Press gently from the wrong side of Cuddle[®] using the synthetic/polyester setting on your iron.

- Sprav baste Odif 505 Temporary Adhesive

WASHING INSTRUCTIONS

- · For best results, wash finished projects in cool water with a gentle detergent. Do not use fabric softener.
- · Dry in a no-heat dryer or line dry.
